LIBRARY SKYLIGHT RENOVATIONS COMPLETE

After ten weeks of renovations, the Dana Point Library is open to the community once again.

The library's aging skylights have been replaced, thanks to a funding from both the *Friends of the Dana Point Library* and the *Orange County Public Libraries*. Built in 1976 as a landmark experiment in energy conservation, the Dana Point Library depends upon a combination of earth-wall insulation and natural lighting.

The building's primary source of light is its large skylights. They deteriorated slowly over the past forty years, to the point where they became completely opaque. The new skylights return the library to its original architectural state: now you can see for yourself how important natural lighting is to the building's design.

We'll be holding a formal reopening ceremony in a month's time to celebrate the completion of the project. Joining us will be Orange County Fifth District Supervisor Pat Bates, Orange County Librarian Helen Fried, Dana Point Mayor Lisa Bartlett, and other special guests. We will conduct a tour of the library and the new renovations during the event. We are awaiting confirmation of an official date – please keep tuned for more details.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Karla Sanders has been appointed by the Board as the new editor of the association's *Sea Scribe* newsletter. We wish her well.

The Board approved a trial run of online book sales. I initiated the process, which has been running as a solo operation since mid-June using Amazon's website as the only outlet.

During the first eleven weeks, we listed 109 select items (books and lecture recordings), of which 49 items were sold for a total profit of nearly \$1100. The average profit was \$22.50 per item. This income is about four or five times as much as we would have made selling them in the bookstore.

Should we establish online sales as permanent activity, we could generate about \$6000-\$8000 annually with a small-time operation. The Carlsbad Friends of the Library makes about \$50 000 annually from their online sales on Amazon; the Mission Viejo Friends of the Library averages

\$ 40 000 per year. Each association has ten volunteers working on their online sales.

We have installed business bookstands at *Tutor & Spunky's Deli* and *Dana Wharf Sportfishing*. They make about \$65–\$75 per month: another source of steady income for the association. The bookstands also help advertise the *Friends of the Library* and the bookstore.

Sales at our temporary store on Pacific Coast Highway have not been as robust as anticipated. However, I have been impressed by the willingness and good spirit of our volunteers in making this move possible – thanks to all involved. Special thanks to Wayne Rayfield, who has not only borne the cost of plumbing repairs at our temporary site, but has acted the part of plumber as well. The move back to our bookstore at the Dana Point Library has been completed.
