Annual General Meeting & Association Board Elections

The Friends of the Dana Point Library will hold its Annual General Meeting in the Community Hall of the Dana Point Library at 33841 Niguel Road on Wednesday 18 February 2015 at 5:00 pm, to elect four new Directors to the Association Board. The three candidates with the highest vote counts will serve for two years (2015 & 2016). The candidate with the fourth-highest vote count will serve for one year (2015).

BOOKSTORE NEWS

With a great group of managers and new volunteers at the bookstore, things are going well. We started selling books online. We opened bookstands in three businesses in town: *J C Beans, Tutor & Spunky's Deli,* and *Dana Wharf Sportfishing*. We have also just added a new book kiosk in the *Niguel Shores Community Association* clubhouse lobby at the start of 2015.

At the beginning of 2014, the Friends of the Dana Point Library donated \$70 000 towards replacing the library's skylights. We learned in spring that the library was to be closed for the summer, while new skylights were being installed. That meant moving the Bookstore.

Thanks to business members *Tavern on the Coast* (owned by Joe and Vicki Scala): they donated a temporary location for the Bookstore on Pacific Coast Highway in downtown Dana Point. This allowed us to stay in operation from June to August 2014.

We had an opportunity to thoroughly clean the Bookstore, build new shelving and reorganize books before the library reopened. After the County raised insurance concerns about selling books from carts at the library entrance, we converted our storage room into an extension of the bookstore. We also built new book displays.

We also made space for a computer workstation to manage our new online sales on Amazon. Thank you to Rodney and Juliette Ravenelle, who donated a computer for this purpose.

We decided to hold a Christmas book sale in November 2014. It was a success, and we plan on making this an annual event.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Most of the activity in the Association takes place in and around the Bookstore. Please read the *Bookstore News* section on page 3 for more information.

The Board has met monthly during the year. Its agendas and minutes are posted on our website at www.friendsdanapoint.org.

In 2014 the Board promoted its major donation of \$70 000 towards the installation of the new skylights in the library. Our biggest challenge was to manage the late announcement that the whole library building was to close for an undetermined number of months during summer to complete the project.

With the help of Cubby Rayfield we found a rent-free space. Foreseeing a substantial loss of income during the library's closure, we sought alternate means of income. This was achieved by establishing book sale points at a couple of businesses, and starting online sales through Amazon. Both have proven very successful: we have made \$ 3430.55 in profits from sales on Amazon since June 2014.

Our distributable income in 2014 has been good, considering the loss of months of regular sales and the

cost of utilities at our temporary location. Please see the *Financial Report for 2014* on page 8 for more details.

We lost three Board members this year: Julie Arnold and Lionel Simons moved out of town, and Bill Shepherd needed to devote more time to his business. Their replacements are Karla Sanders (*Director-at-Large*) and Kat Quinn (*Treasurer*).

Director-at-Large and Bookstore Manager Barbara Anderson has been unwell. Her Bookstore responsibilities have been mostly borne by Juliette Ravenelle. We thank Juliette, and wish Barbara well in the coming months.

Membership numbers have not grown much, except in the Business class, where we gained 15 new members. This is due to the effort of Cubby Rayfield. Please support our business members.

The upcoming election is for three vacant two-year positions, and one one-year position. The Association's strength lies in your involvement. Please attend the *General Meeting & Election* on the 18 February 2015.
